\$1,000,000 OPPORTUNITY

Lost Our Home Building

Centrally located in Tempe, Arizona, our 8,400 square foot building overlooks South Hardy Drive, encompassed by red rocks and desert flora. The inviting exterior features green grass bordering the front doors, creating a pause for dogs before entry. Above the double doors to the Welcome Home Lobby, the "Pet Adoptions" sign stands proudly, marking the hub for adoptions and temporary care reunions.

\$250,000 OPPORTUNITY

Veterinary Clinic Entrance

The clinic entrance will serve as a bustling focal point, acting as the primary reception for all pets seeking veterinary care. This cutting-edge facility will cater to the needs of our shelter's residents, encompassing Temporary Care recipients, as well as rescued and surrendered pets.

\$200,000 OPPORTUNITY

Fun Zone Indoor Play Yard:

This brand new indoor space will be the hub of "happy" for dogs in our care. The 900 square foot space will be an air-conditioned haven that will allow our dogs to run and play and get exercise, even when the temps reach the triple digits. The contained yet open space will allow staff and spectators to witness the fun and enjoy the antics of our canine companions.

\$100,000 OPPORTUNITIES

Safe With Us Surgery Room:

This state-of-the-art surgical space will be used for all in-house surgical procedures conducted by our veterinary team. The space will allow us to perform most routine surgeries on-site including spay and neuters, dental work, soft-tissue removal and fracture resets and repair. This will help reduce overall anxiety for the pets in our care as they will not need to be transported to another location for these procedures.

Rover Retreat Medical Room:

A peaceful seclusion for dogs experiencing any kind of mental stress or physical ailment, the Rover Retreat Medical Room offers care and kindness to pups who are not feeling their best. or when quarantine is required for pets with communicable illnesses. Loving care is always under best medical protocol in sparkling clean, quiet, and sanitary conditions.

Helping Hands Pet Reception:

Whether bringing in a pet for our Temporary Care Program or surrendering them to find a forever home, leaving a pet at the shelter can be an emotional experience. It is with that in mind that we have created the Helping Hands Pet Reception, a private area of the shelter separate from the busy lobby where we can accept pets into our care. This space also houses the Paw Patrol Pet Refuge, an after hours drop-off area where police officers from Tempe and Mesa Police Departments can bring in pets who are found as strays or seized in cases of criminal activity outside of the shelter's open hours.

Fido's Inn Temporary Care Neighborhood:

Fido's Inn serves as a haven for dogs enrolled in both the Temporary Care Program and the Low-Income Boarding initiative. Our Temporary Care Program stands as a pillar of support, offering a nurturing environment for dogs for a period of up to 90 days, sometimes extended to 120 days. This respite becomes essential when families confront life crises that render them temporarily incapable of tending to their beloved pets. These situations encompass a wide array of challenges, ranging from domestic violence and homelessness to hospitalization and behavioral health issues like PTSD. Often, these furry companions are the only family members many individuals have. Within our Temporary Care Program, we step in as caretakers during these trying times, enabling pet owners to receive necessary assistance, whether that means staying in a hospital, behavioral health facility, domestic violence shelter, homeless shelter, or similar circumstances. This support paves the way for individuals to regain their footing and chart a course forward. Once they're prepared, joyful reunions between these pets and their owners take place, embodying the essence of compassion and second chances.

\$75,000 OPPORTUNITIES

Catnip Wellness Center:

Cats arrive at Lost Our Home due to neglect, inadequate care, or even abuse. In this area, staff compassionately nurse sick cats back to health, administering medication and treatments for recovery. The kitty condos, each with a bathroom, bedroom, and main living space, ensure comfort, complete with a view of a shared TV for entertainment.

Ruff Ruff Recreation Yards:

These spaces are a vibrant play haven for dogs, featuring turf for a natural ambiance and ample shade for sun protection. During hotter Arizona months, a misting system and fans keep the Pooch Playground, Fetch Field, and Bark Park cool for pets and volunteers. Pups enjoy playtime, pool dips, and bonding with staff or volunteers.

Kibble Café:

The kitchen is the center of any home. Staff chefs make meals for every pet here. Nutritious food (and treats!) for all of the shelter residents, as well as bowls and other basic supplies are stored here. The busy kitchen is the gateway to the shelter's utility hub where pet dishes and toys are cleaned, water pitchers are filled and an unbelievable amount of laundry is washed on a daily basis.

ReTail Boutique: A pet lover's shopping paradise is located right inside the lobby of Lost Our Home Pet Rescue. Offering necessities like leashes and collars along with fun goodies like scratching posts and toys, the ReTail Boutique has something for everyone. As visitors enter the shelter, they can view an array of items for sale and make purchases to benefit the dogs and cats at Lost Our Home.

\$50,000 OPPORTUNITIES

Helping People Saving Pets Parkway:

The Helping People Saving Pets Parkway connects the New Leash on Life Neighborhood to Fido's Inn, the Bow Wow B & B, the Kibble Café, the Rover Retreat Medical Room, and the Ruff Ruff Recreation Yards. It's a bustling route frequented by volunteers guiding shelter dogs to play yards, staff transporting unwell dogs for treatment, Temporary Care Program participants visiting their pets, and prospective adopters.

Canine Comfort Zone:

Every dog who comes to Lost Our Home starts their journey here. After they are examined and vaccinated, they will remain in the Canine Comfort Zone for three days allowing vaccines to take effect ensuring they are free from illness before moving into the main dog rooms.

Volunteer Academy/Conference Room:

This is the launching pad for volunteers where they are trained on how to socialize with, exercise and tend to the needs of resident pets. Approximately 80 new volunteers per month enter the Volunteer Academy and hundreds return again and again for advanced training classes. Here, animal experts orient new members of the Lost Our Home volunteer team and here internal meetings, board meetings and more take place.

\$25,000 OPPORTUNITIES

Healthy Paws Exam Room:

The Healthy Paws Exam Room provides a dedicated location where Lost Our Home staff members will assess the health and wellbeing of both dogs and cats when they arrive at the shelter. Here, vaccinations will be administered, prescription medications will be dispensed, and medical treatments will be determined and implemented. In the future, this room will also be used for spay/neuter surgeries and dental cleanings so pets can get treatments quicker and without transport to and from the vet clinic.

Kit-N-Kaboodle Kitchen:

Styled like a kitchen, this area is an ideal space for cats in the Temporary Care Program. They can freely explore or take naps in their kitty condos. Complete with a "stove," "fridge," "sink," and cozy seating, the room offers ample soft bedding and toys. Here, cats waiting to reunite with their families can relish a home-like ambiance.

Zen retreat Bedroom:

This space, decorated like a bedroom, is a calming environment. There are "dresser drawers" along the wall for cats to sleep in. Participants in the Temporary Care Program reside here. With soft bedding and lots of toys to occupy their time, these cats won't miss the comforts of home while they wait to be reunited with their families.

Shelter Support Studio

This office houses our Temporary Care and Foster Program Staff members. It is located on the south side of the shelter off of the lobby and along the pathway to the Volunteer Academy/Conference Room and the Volunteer Welcome Center.

\$20,000 OPPORTUNITIES

Healing Paws Cat Cottage

Within the shelter's communal cat rooms, having an isolation area is vital for treating cats with contagious illnesses, ranging from respiratory infections to ringworm. In the Healing Paws Cat Cottage, afflicted cats are accommodated in serene, limited-exposure medical condos, expediting their recovery.

Adoption Dog Suite – Large:

These expansive and comfortable dog retreats are adorned with beloved toys, beds, and blankets. Adoptable dogs enjoy dining, cuddling, and engaging activities, like frozen Kong toys and games, in their shelter home away from home.

Rover Retreat Outdoor Respite

This outdoor yard is accessible from the Rover Retreat Medical Room and offers an exterior space where sick pups can stretch their legs and get some fresh air while they recover from illness.

Prodogtivity Multipurpose Room

The Prodogtivity Multipurpose Room can accommodate up to six staff members and volunteers. It provides an area where small meetings can take place when volunteer training sessions or larger meetings are scheduled in the Volunteer Academy/Conference Room, helping to maximize productivity and efficiency at the shelter.

Volunteer Welcome Center & Break Room:

This is the hub for volunteers, marking the start and end of their shifts. With over 400 volunteers, this bustling space caters to all who generously give their time. Whether for a drink or snack break, it's welcoming for volunteers, staff, and partner organization members. Lockers store personal items, name badges are obtained, and it's a central spot for vital event and shelter updates.

\$15,000 OPPORTUNITIES

Hotel Dog Suite – Large:

During their pet parents' recovery from life crises, up to two canine siblings can find comfort in a spacious Hotel Dog Suite, complete with individual blankets, bedding, food/water, and cherished toys. This room serves as their private haven as they await their owners' return, engaging with Lost Our Home staff and volunteers during their shelter stay. Pet parents can take comfort in the knowledge that their beloved companions are receiving exceptional care in this nurturing environment. (3 sponsorships available.)

Cat Gardens:

Cat gardens, accessible from all cat rooms, provide adoptable and Temporary Care cats a secure outdoor space with sunlight and fresh air. In this enclosed area, they can bask in the sun and relish the outdoors while awaiting adoption or reunion with their families. (2 sponsorships available.)

Adoption Dog Suite – Small:

As adopters stroll through the New Leash on Life Neighborhood and Fresh Start Canine Community, they glimpse into personalized suites where dogs awaiting their forever homes eagerly anticipate their potential families. These individualized rooms are adorned with each dog's preferred bed, toys, and blankets, creating a personal haven for meals, play, and bonding with our team members or volunteers. Hotel Dog Suites – Small:

These compact suites are optimally designed to accommodate either a single dog or two smaller dogs, affording them a dedicated area for relaxation, play, or companionship with a member of the Lost Our Home team or a volunteer. During their interim stay, these dogs can relish their meals and experience the familiar comforts of home, all within the shelter's confines. Despite the temporary nature of their residency, these thoughtfully fashioned, home-like suites offer a snug and inviting respite from their active play and exercise routines. Shelter Support Studios/Executive Suites

These offices are located on the south side of the shelter off of the lobby and along the pathway to the Volunteer Academy/Conference Room and the Volunteer Welcome Center.
